We are looking for new SNAP (Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel) members to join our meetings across North Norfolk. A SNAP Meeting is a public held meeting where we traditionally meet to discuss local concerns and issues, provide updates on police action and vote in our next community policing priorities. Usually we hold these SNAP meetings every 3 months for each Safer Neighbourhood area in an effort to ensure that our community policing priorities remain current and reflect what is important to local residents. Due to the pandemic these meetings have been held virtually over Microsoft Teams.

For North Norfolk these Safer Neighbourhood areas are North Walsham, Cromer, Holt, Wells, Stalham, Sheringham and Fakenham. During the meeting priorities are put forward and it's decided what the policing priority will be for each area for the next 3 months.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Over the last month PC Pegden has met with the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) at a pop-up event at Wells Police Station. During this event, he met with several members of the public and councillors from the town and nearby villages.

He had a positive meeting with the High Sheriff and took him for a trip on the boat in Wells where he met with several members of the community whilst out and about.

PC Pegden has undertaken joint patrols on the IFCA boat and jointly worked with IFCA Officers on high visibility patrols along the coast in both directions patrolling the Harbours.

He has conducted regular foot patrols in the town whilst it has been busy during the summer period.

Regular contact and visits have been made to Holkham whilst the visitor numbers are high. He has patrolled the Holkham Estate whilst camping events have been going on and met with staff.

PC Pegden has conducted a joint visit to Bawsey with the fire service for a drowning prevention action day to educate the users of the lakes and the dangers involved. He also attended a speed watch at Hindringham on two occasions to support the Community Speed Watch team.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st August)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	1	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	4	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
