In recent weeks your local Beat Managers have been carrying out Pop Up Engagement Surgeries across the county. These events are there to give members of the public the opportunity to speak to an officer and to discuss any local issues/concerns and ask questions. These have been really successful in engaging the community.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Wells has been incredibly busy due to the amount of visitors during the Summer holidays. The harbours have seen record numbers and consequently we have increased our police boat patrols with our trained officers and volunteers so we can engage out on the water during busy times. We've also seen an increase in calls for marine related issues and have been joint working with Eastern Fisheries Conservation Officers and have secured joint share of their offshore vessel which we now keep at Wells.

Wells Police Station is opening regularly over the busy period and Police Volunteer and ex Special Chief Officer Malcom Pearson has been assisting PC Pegden with opening. On Thursday 12th August the PCC attended the Wells Police Station Pop Up Surgery alongside PC Pegden to engage with the public.

Wells has a new Beat Manager PC Simon Blakeley who is assisting during the summer months. PC Pegden and PC Blakely have together increased their patrols to the harbours, farm and rural areas to aid with the problem solving for the Summer and to have a greater visible police presence in Wells and along the coast.

The team have continued to work with Holkham and Walsingham as they have seen an increase in reported visitors to the area.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st July)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	2	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	1	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	2	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
